Y11 Arrangements – June Exam-Period

We have been really impressed by the maturity, commitment and conduct shown by all our Y11s, as we approach half term and the halfway period of the exam season.

As previously shared, the study leave programme will be in a different format from Monday 1st June, until the end of the exams. From Monday 1st June, fully study leave commences when attendance (other than for exams) becomes optional.

When not in examinations, during this period, students will have the choice of;

1. **Studying at home;**

2. **Studying in school;**

- Attend a **subject revision session** in school. Attached you will find a programme outlining subjects where a member of the department will be available in their room to answer any questions students may have and to offer 'hints and tips' for the exam. The lessons that have a line through them will not take place because all exams for those subjects have already taken place.
- In a **supervised private study room** where students can revise quietly and independently using resources they have brought with them. It is important to note they will not always have access to computers and staff will not be providing work unless they have been contacted in advance. The attached programme indicates the location of the study rooms and reminders will be posted daily in reception.

3. A **combination** of both study at home and in-school study.

If students follow options 2 or 3, they will need to register as normal in their tutor base at 8.45am (or after 9am, sign in at reception) unless they are in purely for an exam. They will be expected to follow the normal school rules, including those relating to mobile phones. They will not be permitted to 'come and go' during the day or wander around during lesson time. Once students sign out, they should not return to school and must continue their study at home (they are not allowed to be in for the day and sign out for lunch). This is to maintain a positive working atmosphere for the rest of the school community and to ensure we have accurate records in case of emergency. If students are coming in solely for an exam, they do not have to sign in or out as we will have registers from the examination.

Please note, whenever students are in school (for exams and/or study sessions), they must be dressed in full school uniform.

It is obviously a very important time for the students and, with continued application and determination, we look forward to celebrating at both the Celebration of Achievement Evening on 25th June and Prom on 8th July, and then seeing many happy faces on Thursday 20th August, when the long wait for their results will be over.
