On Tuesday 8th, Year 7 will be visited by 25 parents, all with different job roles and career paths as part of our 'Guess the Job' activity. On Tuesday 15th, we will be holding our annual careers fair in the school hall, with each year group having an allocated 30 minutes to browse and speak to the range of employers. This year we will be giving each student a quiz to fill in as they visit the stands, and all completed quizzes will be entered into a prize draw to win a £20 Amazon voucher. Staff will also be promoting careers in lessons by discussing jobs related to their subject, and their own previous jobs to show students how transferable skills can be developed in all roles from those part-time jobs as a teenager to full-time jobs. The Virtual Careers Fair will go live on day 1 of Careers Week. All you need to do is share the website address with students.

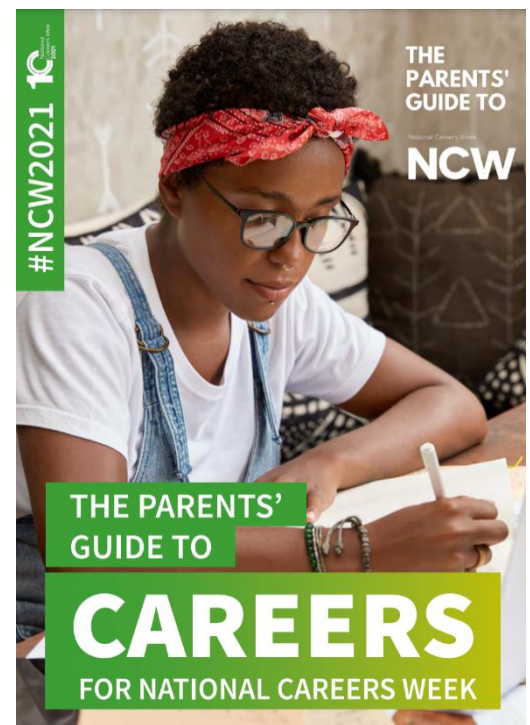
